Departments, Conference Rooms and Amenities

Main Lobby

This gathering space is a waiting area for the Council Chambers and the Schneider Theater. Amenities include a cash machine, restrooms and public phones. Most meetings of advisory commissions will be held in the Council Chambers or the Dakota room.

City Departments

Assessing

Assessing establishes the estimated market value for property tax purposes, oversees the appeals process and classifies property by its use including residential homestead and non-homestead, commercial, industrial and apartment.

City Clerk

The City Clerk's Office conducts state, city and school district elections, issues business and motor vehicle licenses, and maintains records.

Community Development

Community Development partners with the community through planning, economic development and redevelopment activities. The department protects public health and safety by ensuring compliance with state and City codes.

Community Services

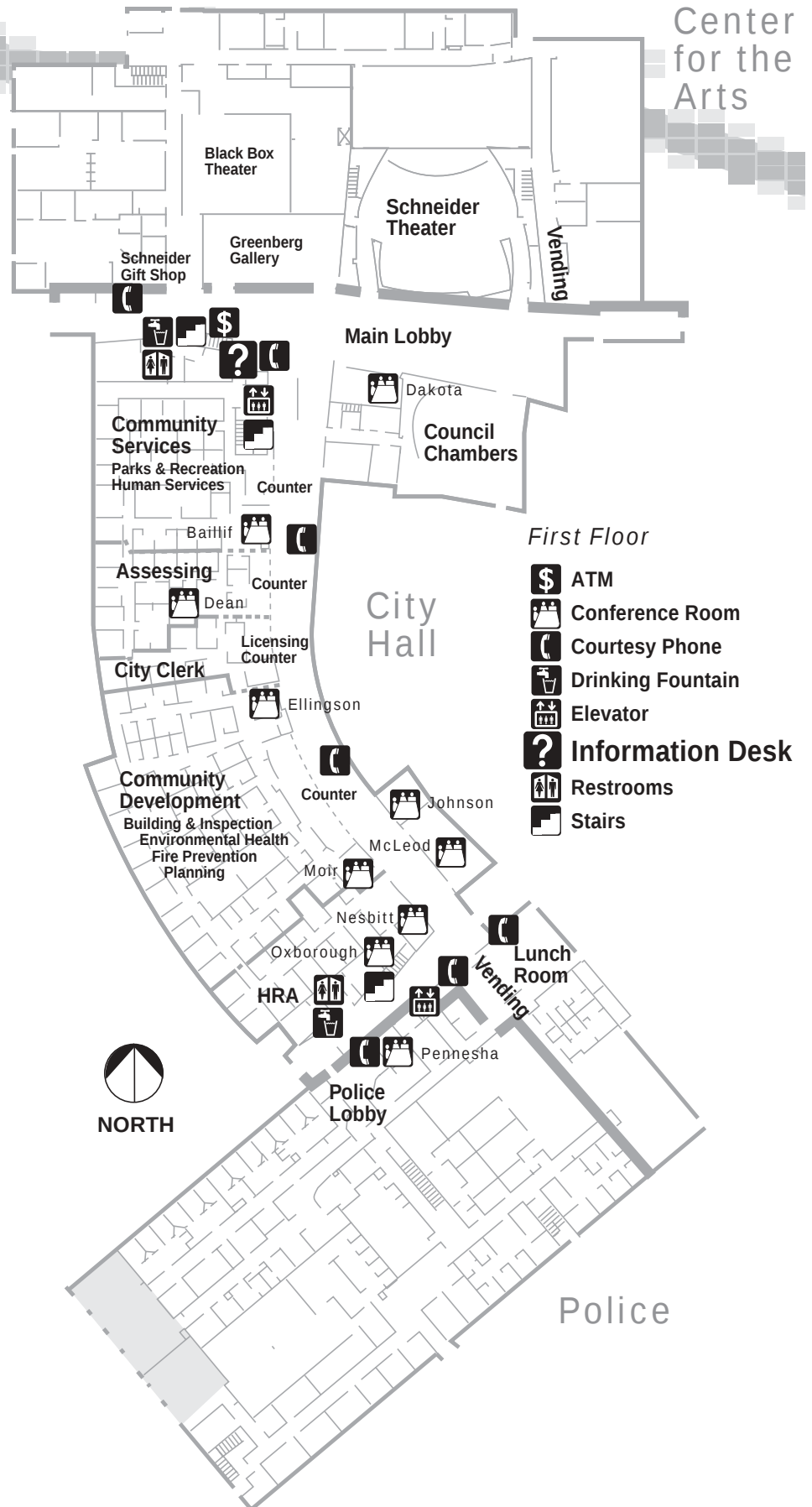
Community Services fosters opportunities for residents, produces City communications, provides public health services, and manages parks and recreational facilities.

Bloomington's 114 officers work with the community to make the city a safer place to live, and partner with residents and businesses to address their diverse needs.

Bloomington Center for the Arts

The Center for the Arts is home to eight organizations that comprise the Bloomington Fine Arts Council. The facility features a 366-seat theater with orchestra pit, visual arts classrooms, studios for dance, pottery and ceramics, and two art galleries.

The City Manager, appointed by the City Council, is solely responsible for the administration of City business.

Human Resources

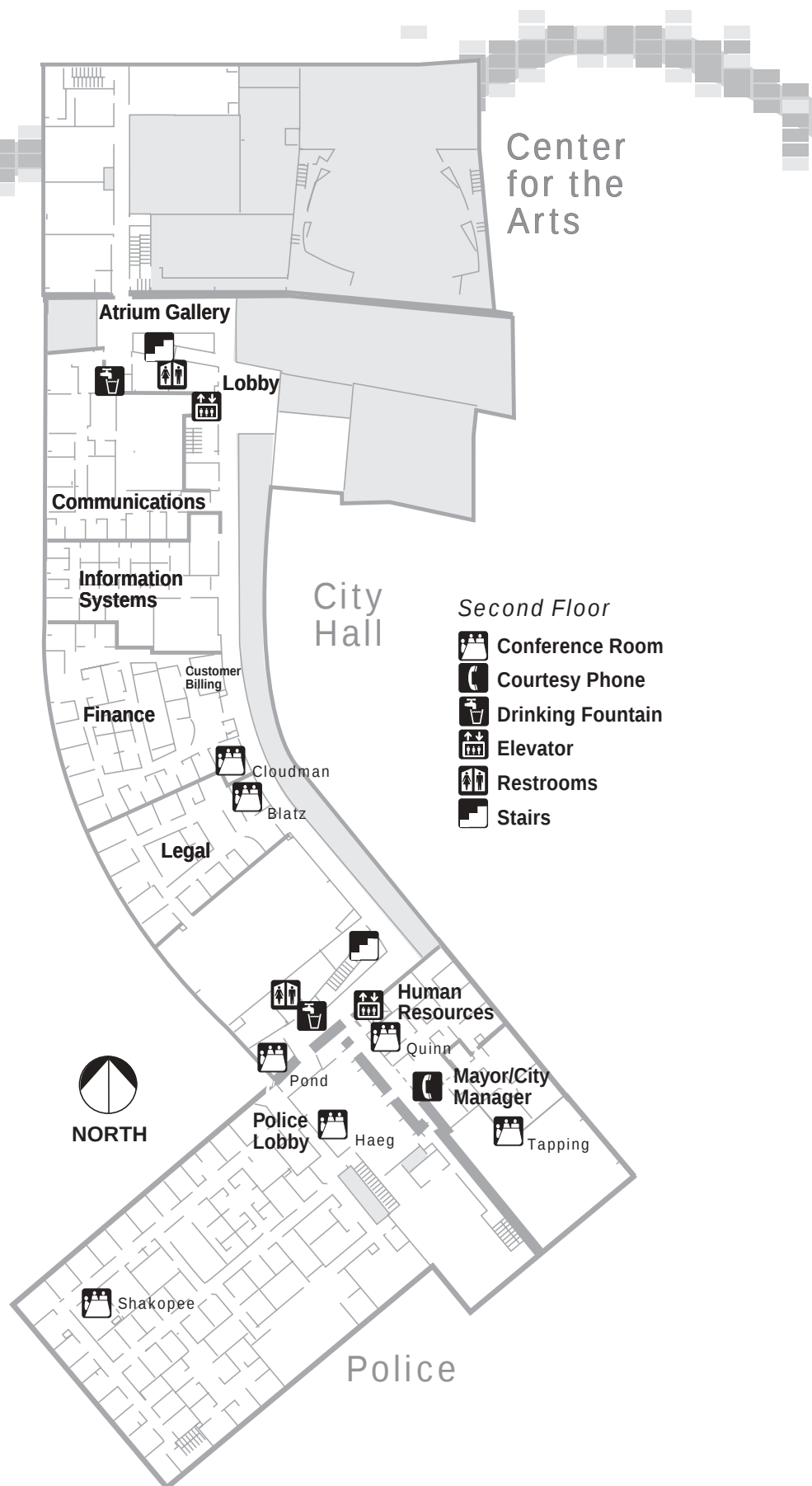
Human Resources coordinates recruitment and hiring, conducts contract negotiations, and administers employee benefits, compensation and job classification.
